Units who qualify for the 2022 Commissioner Challenge are entitled to free cloth rank awards: Packs, Troops, and Crews can receive the following badges without charge from the Scout Shop for the next charter year (January 1, 2023 – December 31, 2023) if all the requirements are completed and submitted by December 2, 2022.

- Cub Scouts Lion, Tiger, Wolf, Bear, Webelos, and Arrow of Light cloth badge.
- Scouts BSA Scout, Tenderfoot, Second Class, First Class, Star, Life, and Eagle cloth badge, Eagle recognition kit, and Merit Badges
- Venturing Star, Life, and Eagle cloth badge, Eagle recognition kit, merit badges, Venturing, Pathfinder, Discovery, and Summit recognition kits.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- 1) Journey to Excellence Award: The Journey to Excellence Award is a national recognition for units that achieve certain objectives measuring aspects of a quality program. Throughout the year, the unit works towards fulfilling the requirements and completing the objectives. For a unit to earn the Commissioner Challenge award, the unit must meet or exceed the gold level objectives of the Journey for Excellence. Units should submit their Journey to Excellence application with their charter renewal paperwork before the designated on-time charter renewal date.
- 2) The application form must be turned in with the on-time charter renewal: All charter renewal documents must be turned in no later than the close of business on the publicized on-time charter renewal date.

FINANCIAL REQUIREMENTS

- 3) Friends of Scouting: From January to April, families of Scouts and other friends of Scouting are asked to make a donation towards the support of the council. Typically, a presentation is made at a pack meeting or a court of honor to the families of the unit. To qualify for this objective, the unit must raise a minimum of FOS funds equivalent to total raised the prior year plus an additional 10%.
- **4) Popcorn and Scout-O-Rama Fundraising Goal:** February through May, Scouts sell family admission tickets to Scout-O-Rama. One \$10 coupon card allows the entire family to enjoy Scout-O-Rama as well as providing a full year's worth of coupons. Furthermore, 30% of each ticket sale (\$3) stays with the unit. A unit's goal is calculated to be one ticket for each scout registered in the unit at the time of Scout-O-Rama.

In September, units receive a consignment of popcorn for the Scouts to "show and sell" in front of stores and door-to-door. The Scouts also collect orders from friends, neighbors, and others and the "take order" popcorn is delivered to the Scouts for distribution in November. A unit's goal is determined to be \$100 of popcorn product for each scout registered in the unit at the time of the popcorn selling season. Approximately 1/3 (33%) of all popcorn sales stay with the unit.

To satisfy this Scout-O-Rama and Popcorn Fundraising objective, a unit must meet the *both* fundraising objectives for Popcorn sales and Scout-O-Rama tickets.

MEMBERSHIP RECRUITMENT

- 5) District or Council Volunteer: A district and the council exist for the purpose of building strong units. This is accomplished through district/council volunteers serving as unit commissioners, trainers, camp promotion team members, etc. Some of the district/council opportunities for significant service are short-term while others are year-round. Your district commissioner, program chair, district chair, or district executive can identify opportunities for significant leadership service within the district or council. Even if an individual has multiple unit registrations, one volunteer may only satisfy this objective for one unit. Your unit must have a volunteer registered in a district committee or commissioner position to satisfy this requirement.
- 6) Recruitment Event: It is vital that a unit grow its membership to be successful. Youth leave the unit for a variety of reasons, including the normal aging out process. To satisfy this requirement, every unit must hold some type of recruitment event during the calendar year. It can be a back to school night, a bring a friend activity, or something similar. The key is to expose a youth to the Scouting program who is not currently a member.

PROGRAM INVOLVEMENT

- 7) Scout-O-Rama: Scout-O-Rama is held at History Park in Kelley Park in San Jose. At this event, units have booths showcasing fun, interactive, exciting games, crafts, and projects. When a unit participates in Scout-O-Rama, it gives the scouts of the unit the opportunity to show off what makes their unit special as well as exposing the scouts to the skills of other units and other levels and aspects of scouting.
- 8) Roundtable Attendance: The District Roundtable is a monthly gathering of Scout leaders. It is a major source of intermediate training in Scouting skills, and provides an opportunity to meet other leaders to exchange "Best Practices". To satisfy this requirement, a unit needs to send at least one **registered** adult to at least eight (8) District Roundtables during the year. Note that you may send a different leader every month if you choose.
